Reflection for the 7th Sunday after Trinity

When people talk of 'Christian morality' nine times out of ten they mean Christian sexual morality. Issues like lust, adultery, divorce,

homosexuality come to the forefront of their minds. When, however, you read the gospels carefully you see that these subjects, important as they are, pale into insignificance by comparison with Jesus' teaching on other moral issues. Other themes which have more prominence than sex include non-violence, simplicity of life, inner motivation, care for the weak, the innocent and those on the margins of society and the priority of the demands of love over other laws.

He taught these things not only in his words but also in his deeds. Another theme of great importance in Jesus' teaching concerns money and wealth. There are far more examples of his views on this subject than on the issue of sex. The gospel reading for the 7th Sunday after Trinity contains material typical of Jesus' approach. Greed, acquisitiveness, possessiveness, love of money, these are all moral vices according to Jesus and those who belong to God's kingdom must overcome them as well as they can. Like some other teachings of Jesus his pronouncements on this topic contain hyperbole or exaggeration to emphasise his point, the most famous being, 'It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the Kingdom of God.' (Matt. 19.24)

Nevertheless, we must take his teachings on this subject seriously. In the world we live in today, a world dominated by wealth, or the lack of it, it is doubly important to remember Jesus' teaching. There is a very powerful saying at the heart of today's gospel which we would be wise to take to heart. It is this: 'one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions.' Virtually all of us living here in Dorchester have an abundance of possessions. I know I do. But we need to be careful if what we possess comes to define who we are. Material things are, of course, important, and I would be a fool to say that it is always better to be poor than to be rich. But often riches can be a barrier to genuine human flourishing. Furthermore, material things are transient and passing whereas spiritual things last forever. The old saying 'you can't take it with you' has a great deal of truth within it. Jesus summed it up another way: 'Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth ... but lay up for yourselves treasure in heaven For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.' (Matt. 6.19-21)
