Reflection for Sunday after Ascension

Jesus Prayed For You And Me

On the night that he was betrayed Jesus took bread and broke it, he took a cup of wine and blessed it, he rose from the meal and washed his disciples' feet. We know this so well. The Gospel reading for today, John 17:20-26, reminds us of something we so often forget, that later on the same night The Lord, having prayed for his disciples, prayed for you and me. *"I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word," v20.*

He prayed for our unity, the pattern for this unity being the relationship between the Father and the Son and the purpose of this unity was to be mission, *"so that the world may believe that you have sent me." v21.* It is a unity that transcends organisations, nationalities, ethnicities, cultures and languages, and goes beyond styles of worship. The Lord Jesus' eye goes beyond that moment to glory at the Father's right hand, the glory he had with the Father before the world began (v5).

The Lord expresses the desire of his heart for all who have believed or will believe in him throughout history until he comes again in glory, *"Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world." v24.* How very humbling yet encouraging for all who acknowledge Christ as their Saviour and their Lord.

The Lord also says something quite surprising, *"The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one." v22.* When we look at the Church throughout history and today it has not always covered itself in glory! And yet... the Lord has given his Church his glory for the purpose of binding the church together in unity. A glory given not simply as a future hope but a present reality. However, we are reminded throughout John's Gospel that "the way of the cross is the way of true glory." (Leon Morris). "We must never think of our cross as our penalty; we must think of it as our glory." (William Barclay). The sustaining power of his glory continues to be seen in remarkable testimonies amongst his suffering church, as well as the assurance of seeing the glory of the ascended, reigning King of glory in heaven.

Grant us, Lord, a glimpse of your glory when we gather in worship; to be united by your glory as we reach out to a broken world; to be sustained by your glory in tough times; and to look forward to seeing you in all your glory when you call us home. Amen




