Reflection for 2nd of Easter

Our Gospel reading from John this Sunday includes the story that every Sunday School child can recount, the story of Thomas, Doubting Thomas as he is known, although perhaps we should be a little less judgmental and call him questioning Thomas instead. Although most of us, when reading this passage, will be drawn to this familiar story, it is something else that resonates with me. It is the extraordinary phrase 'he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

In John's account of the gifting of the Holy Spirit, it is given to the disciples in the breath, the pneuma of the crucified and risen Jesus. Jesus breathes out as one who is speaking and as one who is sharing the breath from his lungs, the very breath of life. There is an echo of the creation story here, just as God formed humans from the dust and breathed the breath of life into their nostrils to create a living being, so Jesus breathes new life into his disciples as they begin their new lives as proclaimers of the Good News. And as Christians we also share in the gifting of the spirit, we too experience the breath of Christ when we open our hearts and minds to the possibility of being members of the body of Christ and sharing the Gospel message as Jesus instructed. Just as we breathe in the breath of Christ, so must we breathe it out in the form of Spirit inspired words which we in turn can use to inspire others to walk in the footsteps of Jesus.

The breath of Jesus both inspires and equips. It also enables the disciples and in turn all of us in the mission which Jesus explains to them in our reading. The disciples are instructed and empowered to both forgive sins and act as judge to those who do not deserve such forgiveness, their Spirit inspired words will be declarations of divine fact. This is not to say that they are being sent forth as some sort of holy judicial party, to judge and pass sentence on all whom they encounter. It is more that they bear and share the compassion that Jesus had for the wounded humanity he encountered. For Jesus, the Messiah whose first words to his friends on his return from the dead were "peace be with you", it is this peace that comes hand in hand with challenge and forgiveness, with affliction and comfort. So as we take up the mantle and proclaim the Good News we must always remember to adopt these Christ-like qualities.

I leave you with the alternative preface for this Sunday: Risen Christ
For whom no door is locked, no entrance barred:
Open the doors of our hearts,
That we may seek the good of others
And walk the joyful road of sacrifice and peace,
To the praise of God the Father.
Amen




